Today's New York Times story, "Delay, Deny, Deflect: How Facebook Leaders Leaned Out in Crisis" is emblematic of a broader problem throughout our society. The misbehavior of companies this large and powerful has had and will continue to have dangerous consequences for our nation. When the decisions of corporate executives play such an outsize role in our nation's marketplace of ideas, when Americans' access to accurate information and our freedom of expression depends on these business leaders' moral compass, and when digital dominance translates into excessive economic and political power, it is clear that this industry can no longer skate by with so-called "self regulation."

Almost all other sectors of the economy have laws and sector-specific regulators in addition to antitrust review. It is time for the tech sector to receive this scrutiny as well. While antitrust enforcers should be encouraged to do their jobs, Congress must not wait, but act immediately to address this issue as well. We have discussed this further in a recent opinion article, "Antitrust Alone Won't Save Us From the Curse of Bigness." Now is the time to launch hearings and investigations with a goal of legislation that provides effective oversight for dominant tech companies.
